

Warden Training

The Warden course is designed to provide participants with the skills and knowledge to perform the duties of a Warden or Area Warden. Participants will learn how to implement emergency procedures and the responsibilities and duties of a warden.

Australian Standard 3745 recommends that the Emergency Control Organisation participate in a skills retention activity every 6 months.

Nationally Recognised Training

On successful completion of this course, students will be issued with a nationally recognised Statement of Attainment for:

- PUAFER005 Operate as part of an emergency control organisation



Duration and Location

This course is delivered over 3 hours. Warden Training can be delivered at your premises or at a Chubb training facility.

Content

- Planning for emergencies
- Life safety systems and equipment
- Warden roles and responsibilities
- Human behavior during emergencies
- Responding to emergency reports, signals and warnings
- Anticipating the further development of emergencies
- Assisting with post initial response



Course Participation

This course is limited to a maximum of 15 participants.

Participants require the following for the course:

- Photo identification
- Copy / knowledge of their workplace emergency response manual/ procedures
- Their warden identification marker(s) – for example the red or yellow helmet, vest, or similar
- Any checklists for their area or floor

Language, Literacy and Numeracy

Participants are required to understand the main ideas in documents such as safety data sheets or an emergency plan, write at least one paragraph and participate in basic oral communication to successfully complete this course.

Assessment

You will be assessed with a combination of short answer written questions and practical activities.
